I've never traveled to Yosemite National Park – it's one of those destinations on my list to get to, even more so after hearing a beautiful story on NPR about the oldest and longest serving park ranger there. And this individual's perspective was the perfect reminder about how we approach our High Holidays, and really, how we approach our lives. They call this ranger Yosemite Bob and he first visited the park in high school, and basically never left. But what I found most amazing was the simplicity of his advice – and how much his words resonate for each of us in our lives everyday. He was asked what he would tell anyone visiting the park for the first time. And he said, quite simply, "don't try to hurry your way through the park. I have been here over 40 years, and I haven't seen the whole thing. You can't see the whole thing. You just have to say, ok, I'm going to enjoy what I get to enjoy."

Shouldn't that be the reality for everything in our lives? We try our best to accomplish so much, every day. And in the process, there are times we miss the moments. We miss the opportunity to enjoy not just what we are engaged in, we miss the opportunity simply to enjoy. We have developed a pace in our world today that is insane. We've not just bought into it – we have embraced it. We are afraid that we might miss something – but quite possibly, in the process, we are missing the simplest things that are occurring right in front of us, right now.

Therein lies the beauty of our faith. Before there were emails, or blackberries, streaming video or DVRs, our Judaism recognized how important it is to create checkpoints in our lives. Moments, holidays that help us slow down and remind ourselves of what truly is most important. These Yamim Noraim, these days of repentance, are to be our time of introspection and reflection, a time when we hear the shofar and it wakes us up to see, to feel, to sense, to recognize and to appreciate our blessings.

## EARLY CHILDHOOD LEARNING CENTER

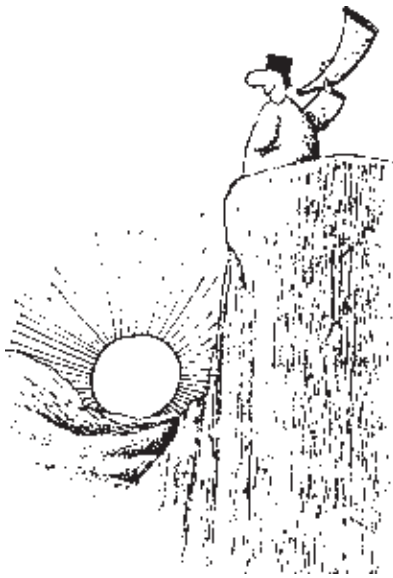
